This term we hosted our first 'Bid Writing Working Group' meeting. Through this group of experienced bid writing parent volunteers, we hope to further expand the schools provision for our children with a focussed approached on targeting funding opportunities. Thank you to this team for agreeing to give up this time.

We are pleased with the impact of sending more of our correspondence to you by email. From Wednesday 6th February, we will be sending the vast majority of our letters to you by email. Whilst they continue to raise the agreed funds, we will press on with a planning application to the local authority. I will let you know when the application has been submitted, so we can all get involved in supporting the application.

We are please to confirm that we have received three times the number of applications we have for our reception places for September 2019.

Bonneville has been on an incredible journey to raised standards through an approach of high expectations, memorable and inspirational teaching and learning, an exciting and engaging curriculum and quality relationships with pupils and the community. We are thrilled with the outcomes of this work and I thank everyone on the hard work and commitment from pupils and staff.
