- Use talk to share our facts about animals and ask questions of others.

- Discuss animal welfare and how to look after our planet.
- We will discuss philosophical questions, such as 'is it a good idea to have a pet lion?'
- Continue to develop our communication skills to support us to resolve conflicts with our friends.

As unique children we will:

- Continue to discuss our family and home experiences with our friends.
- Learn about different animals and understand that all animals are unique like ourselves.
- Talk about our favourite species and share why we love them with our friends.
- Discuss our own pets at home with our peers.

In literacy we will:

- Write about our trip to the zoo and write a letter to the zoo, thanking the staff for our fantastic trip.
- Make animal fact files on an animal of our choice.
- Create posters to 'Save our Planet'.
- Write in a variety of styles, including speech bubbles, comic strips and short stories.
- Read 'Rumble in the Jungle' and develop our understanding of rhyming words and poetry.
- Make posters and signage to promote our event for 'Bonneville High Street'.

As sport stars we will:

- Experiment with different ways of moving to represent different animals through dance and movement.
- Warmup using animal movement cards.
- Weekly P.E lessons with Mr Wright on Mondays.

As artists and designers we will:

Bonneville Driver: Communication


As effective communicators, we will focus on asking questions to learn about different animal species and their habitats.
