Finally we have come to the end of the year having achieved so much.

Having led the school for a year as Interim Headteacher, I feel privileged to be returning in September as the Headteacher. My five years of being the Deputy Headteacher has given me great insight into what our children need, and I am fully committed to working with the Governors, Staff and the community in developing a school that meets and exceeds these needs. Under my leadership, the challenges of change will bring greater opportunities for our children of which I am excited for the future. So far we have in place a Lower Key Stage 2 Phase Leader Post a new Sports Subject Leader Post and two Resource Officer Posts.

Over the next year we will be developing our staffing in the provision of music, sport, the teaching of Spanish, outreach support for families, capacity to support behaviour for learning and the appointment of a new Deputy Headteacher.

Most excitedly, I am happy to share the first stage of our plan to redesign and develop our front entrance. Over the holidays we will be consolidating our two ICT suites into one room, giving us the space to relocate the front administrative office into the ICT suite behind my room. From September the front office will simply be functional in responding to your day to day queries as we begin designing our new look office. We plan to have this complete by the end of the Autumn term.

I am pleased to present the year 2 results as Reading 83%, Writing 71% and Maths 80% Level 2b+. Year 6 results are Reading 93%, Writing 84% and Maths 93% level 4+. We feel extremely pleased with our children who have worked terribly hard to do their best leaving results at Bonneville of which they can be proud.

This is the time of year that we say many goodbyes.

Year 6 who are moving on to their new secondary schools. I think we can all safely admit that they have outgrown primary school and are ready for the next adventure in their lives. We wish them all the best as they embark on the variety of opportunities that will be open to them. Come back and visit us!

Last Friday we said goodbye to Ms Hillman who has been the Headteacher of our school for 11 years. We had an assembly where both choirs performed, we sang songs and shared our memories and presented her with cards. Ms Hillman will always be fondly remembered by the whole school community. We look forward to her many visits with us.

At the end of this term Erica Easy, who has worked as a general teaching assistant in our school for 3 years, Sarah Quigley, our schools Librarian for 12 years, Kelly Barrett, who has been the schools Learning mentor for 9 years along with Gisela Wilkinson who has worked in our school for 21 years, will be departing from Bonneville on to pastures new. We would like to thank you all for your years of service at our school and the impact you have had on the lives of our children over time. Your commitment to improving outcomes for young people in our community can never be questioned and for this on behalf of us all as a community we thank you and wish you all the very best for the future.

Lastly, I would like to congratulate Ann Anderson, our Teaching Assistant for 25 years continued service to Lambeth. Ann started at Bonneville working as a member of the kitchen team and only left to have your daughter Michaela, returning to us after 3 years and never leaving again. Your substantial years service to our school and community is one to be admired, thank you for your hard work, willing nature and daily dose of Ann smile that keeps us all going. We look forward to many more years of working with you.

To all of our families, keep safe, enjoy the holidays and I will see you on the gate ready for the new year on Wednesday 3rd September.
