We have been extremely busy this half term, many areas of the school have been reviewed with some very positive outcomes.

On Wednesday 19th April the Local Authority conducted a Health and Safety audit of the school. The auditor was highly impressed with the processes, procedures, training and organisation of the school and awarded Bonneville the highest, Gold status.

On Friday 21st April our Local Authority improvement advisor visited our school and spent the day scrutinising the standards of the outcomes in our children's books, from Nursery to Year 6. Impressed as ever, she took photographs and has been sharing our outcomes with other schools.

On Tuesday 25th April Ofsted conducted a section 8 monitoring visit of the school. This consisted of one Inspector reviewing parts of the school. The school achieved as best as it could, against the framework to which it was being monitored. Her findings will be outlined to you in a letter within the next four weeks. Thank you for the unanimous support given to the school, with 97% of you saying you would recommend our school and all categories of strongly agree outweighing that of agree. Thank you to all of the staff who have worked incredibly hard to make the school the friendly, exciting, nurturing and stimulating place it is for our children, where they are truly at the heart of everything we do.

From September we will be offering 30 hours free educational childcare for 3 to 4 year olds. If you, your family or your friends are interested please ask Clarissa in the office for more information on the criteria which applies.

Last week we successfully recruited to our HLTA Computing post, since the departure of Mr Duhon. On Monday 5th June, Mr Ganouna will be joining our team, supporting computing lessons across the school and running various ICT after school clubs. The Digital Leaders had the opportunity to meet and interview our candidates and gave him the thumbs up too!
