Frequently Asked Questions

Will my child be tested for COVID at school without my permission? *No, for any symptoms detected that cause us concern, parents will be asked to collect their child/ren immediately and conduct a home test.*

Will I be told if there are any proven cases at school? *Only if we need you to take action, whilst maintaining confidentiality.*

Surely you won't be able to social distance children from each other?

The guidance is to social distance bubbles from each other. Children in the same bubble will be able to come within 1 metre of each other. This way, manageable infection control measures can be put in place.

Autumn Term Arrangements

Please ensure you use the information below informing you of when and where you are dropping and collecting your child.

Remember, siblings from other classes and year groups can be dropped off and collected at the same time, if you have one child in a class starting at 8.45am. They will be able to join the other year group class, during the beginning and end of the school day, for your convenience.

Drop Off and Collection Gates

Below is a table showing the gate that children in each year group need to be dropped off at and collected from. Please note, children attending Reading Café (in the morning) and Carry on Café (in the afternoon) need to be dropped off and collected from the same gates.

Accessing Education Principles for Parents and Carers

1. Do not bring or send your child to school if they have coronavirus symptoms, and access a test as soon as possible.
2. Should the school contact you raising concerns for your child's health, specifically related to coronavirus symptoms, make arrangements for the immediate collection of your child, who will remain isolated until you arrive.
3. Promote the regular cleaning of hands more often than usual - with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered, at home.
4. Promote the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
5. Promote the avoidance of touching your mouth, nose and eyes.
6. If your child 'Goes home alone' actively promote that they do so with no loitering or waiting for their friends. Particularly if they are not in the same 'Bubble' group.
7. Leave the area (school gates) as soon as you have dropped your child/ren off at school.
8. Do not attempt to access the school grounds without prior invitation from school staff. Instead, access the school by calling or emailing the administrative team.
9. Drop your child to school and collect them on time.
