Thank you all for your support during the first week of our return to school this year. With a 98% return of pupils, I feel proud that we have all put our children's wellbeing and education, within the safest possible practices, at the heart of our thinking. As a school, we are committed to putting our children's school based experiences first. For this reason, as a community, we need to do even better to help each other feel safe bringing children to and from school. To do this, I have three very simple requests:

1) When dropping your child/ren to school, please leave the area immediately. Whilst this goes against everything I would like to promote for our community, children getting to school safely must come first. Continue your conversation on the telephone, but please leave the school area as soon as your child is on the school premises. We are doing everything we can to accommodate siblings, so parents do not have to wait around. Please say goodbye to your children on your walk to school and like a conveyor belt, **keep it moving!**

2) If you can wear a face covering, please do so. We have spread the entrances and exits to reduce footfall at any one gate, and this has been hugely successful. However, this does sit within the government guidance of wearing a face covering when a meter distance cannot be achieved between adults.

3) Please do not stand or park in the road. Whilst I continue to lobby for the school streets closure outside our school, currently cars still have right of way through Bonneville Gardens. It is unsafe for us to choose standing in the road with our children, when there are no restrictions in place. We have provided markings on the pavement for your use.

On a daily basis, senior leaders are reviewing, evaluating and modifying our processes in response to what is happening. Your support and patience is greatly appreciated at this time, whilst we all adapt.

Whilst we are about to enjoy the weekend, please restrict your interactions in line with government guidance and protect our school bubbles and community.

I look forward to seeing you with face coverings and moving swiftly, at the gate on Monday Morning.

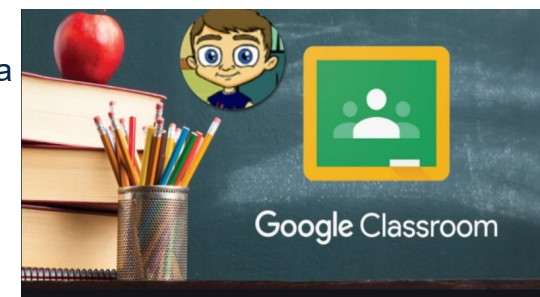

## Virtual School moving to Google Classroom

All schools are required to have an online learning platform that can be easily accessed should a local lockdown be enforced, or a bubble is required to quarantine for 14 days. We are keen to ensure our children can continue to access a quality education, including targeted activities and quality feedback and marking. Therefore, in future, our children will access their learning using Google Classroom.



As our readiness for this is essential, over the next few days you will receive your child's login information from the school office. To access Virtual School, please visit [classroom.google.com](https://classroom.google.com)

Whilst children are required to be in school, our Google Classroom will be not active. However, please ensure you login and familiarise yourself with the space. Once active, you will be able to see any messages from the teachers and view your child's assignments (work). You will be able to view work and submit tasks. ## 'Looking back and Moving Forward'

This term we have planned a bespoke PSHE curriculum for our children across our 3 partnership schools. We have called it; 'Looking Back and Moving Forward.' ## Frequently Asked Questions

**Whilst my child is attending school, how can I best protect the vulnerable family members at home?** As soon as children get home from school, encourage them to take their uniform off, bathe and wear house clothes. Please remember to wash school uniform as frequently as you can

**My child is allergic to hand sanitiser.** All children are handwashing throughout the day. Hand sanitiser cleanses can be replaced with handwashing instead

**How are you addressing individual Special Educational Needs for children who may require closer contact? How will first aid be administered?** Individual risk assessments are put in place for specific children

PPE is available to staff members is needed when responding to individual needs or emergencies.

### Accessing Education Principles for Parents and Carers

1. Do not bring or send your child to school if they have coronavirus symptoms, and access a test as soon as possible.
2. Should the school contact you raising concerns for your child's health, specifically related to coronavirus symptoms, make arrangements for the immediate collection of your child, who will remain isolated until you arrive.
3. Promote the regular cleaning of hands more often than usual - with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered, at home.
4. Promote the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
5. Promote the avoidance of touching your mouth, nose and eyes.
6. If your child 'Goes home alone' actively promote that they do so with no loitering or waiting for their friends. Particularly if they are not in the same 'Bubble' group.
7. Leave the area (school gates) as soon as you have dropped your child/ren off at school.
8. Do not attempt to access the school grounds without prior invitation from school staff. Instead, access the school by calling or emailing the administrative team.
9. Drop your child to school and collect them on time.
