Dear All,

Congratulations on getting through the term!

As we draw nearer to the end of the academic year, I write to share our planning for the start of September with you.

Thank you all for your involvement in our Home School Collaboration Survey. As a collective, you have shared with us that your top three priorities are:

- 1) Extra Maths, English and Reading
- 2) Early assessment activities and identification of pupil gaps
- 3) Extra pastoral support including pupils' wellbeing

We are keen that these themes are built into our forward planning. Further information on our catch up strategy will be shared with you in September, once we have had more opportunity to collaborate with the wider staff team.

Risk Assessment

As a result of the changing landscape of the coronavirus, and the government's loosening of lockdown, the guidance for schools returning in September has been updated. With this new information, we have reviewed our risk assessment, which will be shared with you before the children return in early September. The main idea is that all that has existed for the current smaller bubbles of 15 children will apply to a larger year group bubble.

The key points are:

- All children are expected to attend school
- Our bubbles will become year group bubbles that will not mix with any other bubble (year group)
- Children within their bubble (year group) can be within 2 metres of each other, including the adults they work with (although we will encourage our staff to be mindful of distance at all times)
- Staggered timings for morning drop off, playtimes and end of the day will remain
- Extended wrap around provision of childcare will be available
- Pupil, Parents and Staff Principles will remain
- Additional cleaning and hygiene routines will continue
- No parent access on school premises will continue

September Return Dates

Wednesday 2nd September- Nursery and Reception only

Monday 7th September- Year 1 to Year 6

Virtual Parent Consultations

Virtual Parent Consultations will take place on between Wednesday 2nd September and Friday 4th September. During this time, every parent will have a virtual meeting appointment to discuss the academic and pastoral needs of their child, with their child's Class teacher.

The Tucasi portal, to book your slot, will go live over the Summer Holiday period.

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You will be notified of this.

As parent access to teachers will be significantly reduced, and as part of our catch-up strategy, we will also include weekly class virtual consultations with parents. This will be a 20 minute sharing of the weeks' learning session and advice on how you can support your child at home. You will also have the opportunity to ask any questions you may have, including the opportunity for a private meeting if you need one.

The 'Year Group Bubble'

In line with the latest guidelines, bubbles will now become year groups. That means we will operate all activities within year groups, including the handling of resources, with no cross over with other year groups. For example, year groups will stay together at playtimes and there will be no whole school assemblies.

We will also use this structure to manage our wrap around care (breakfast and after school) with children remaining in their year groups.

Staggered starts

Based on the scientific advice and government guidelines, we know that our priority needs to remain in supporting the community to reduce viral transmission between adults. For this reason, we are going to retain our staggered start and collection times, whilst spreading the access points. One class from each year group will have the same start time.

The school day will continue to end by 1pm on Fridays, to enable additional deep cleaning and the planning and preparation time for teachers.

On Friday, you will receive a specific timetable detailing your class schedule and school access gate.

Siblings

Because half of the school (1 class from each year group) will begin at each start time, and we are accommodating the mixing of children within year groups, if a child is a sibling and their actual class start time is not until 9am, they can start at 8.45 and be absorbed by the fellow class.

For example, a child in 6K (start time 9am above) with a sibling in 4H (start time 8:45am above), may be dropped off at 8.45am and absorbed by 6W (at 8.45am) until 9am.

If you are a family with siblings, you must use the earliest possible point of arrival for your children. We have mapped out the siblings and know who to expect for each group. You will also be able to collect them at the earlier time.

Our internal timetabling will mean children will not miss out.

Lunches

The caterers will continue to serve packed lunches only, for now. Free school meal children will continue to be provided with a packed lunch. Should you wish to purchase packed lunches, you may order these in the usual way. We are continuing to work with ISS to move towards the administering of hot lunches over the course of the term.

Accessing Education Parent Guidelines

We are asking that parents continue to adhere to our Accessing Education Guidelines. This includes parents not entering the school playground, not congregating outside the school gates and instead, leaving the area promptly.

As a Partnership, we have carefully considered the measures we will put in place to secure safety for everyone, whilst providing our core function of education for all of our children. Should there be any changes to the government guidance, over the Summer Holiday break, which affects the plans outlined to you in this letter, we will be in touch via email.

We cannot wait to have every child back in school learning with their friends, where they belong.

Please have a wonderful, restful, peaceful and safe Summer holiday break.

Accessing Education Principles for Parents and Carers

1. Do not bring or send your child to school if they have coronavirus symptoms, and access a test as soon as possible.
2. Should the school contact you raising concerns for your child's health, specifically related to coronavirus symptoms, make arrangements for the immediate collection of your child, who will remain isolated until you arrive.
3. Promote the regular cleaning of hands more often than usual - with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered, at home.
4. Promote the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
5. Promote the avoidance of touching your mouth, nose and eyes.
6. If your child 'Goes home alone' actively promote that they do so with no loitering or waiting for their friends. Particularly if they are not in the same 'Bubble' group.
7. Leave the area (school gates) as soon as you have dropped your child/ren off at school.
8. Do not attempt to access the school grounds without prior invitation from school staff. Instead, access the school by calling or emailing the administrative team.
9. Drop your child to school and collect them on time.
