Thank you to everyone who attended the Home Learning Workshop delivered on Monday evening this week. I do hope you all found it useful to learn more about how to use google classroom and our catch-up strategy, as I was able to cover the cancelled meetings agenda within this session. The full PowerPoint will be available on the schools website for your reference. I will also use this Buzz to update you on the topical points of interest. As mentioned in the meeting, we are sourcing a digital program to support the teaching and learning of reading, in order to reduce the exchanging and movement of school reading books between households. Reading workshops for EYFS/KS1 and KS2 have been scheduled to support you with how to access this resource. It will be well worth attending!

I am currently working with ISS (new caterers) to plan the reinstatement of our hot food menu. As we will not be using the canteen for shared use across the school, we are outlining our options for the safe distribution of hot food, whilst managing overall costs. We are planning for this to happen as quickly as possible, so keep an eye out for the imminent change to the school lunch offer.

In order to support the smooth running in the management of school meals, it is imperative that all children's meals are selected on Scopay. This includes children entitled to Free School Meals and Universal Free School Meals (applicable to children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2).

I am aware of the challenges many of you are facing with the early Friday collection. This is supporting us with the additional cleaning and our ability to ensure bubbles are not compromised within our staffing capacity. We are working towards a January return to this.

To keep the community safe, including the school remaining open to children, I am requesting that everyone wears a mask when dropping children to and from school. Our ability to social distance is inevitably restrictive. In such circumstances, the government guidance is clear that face masks should be worn. So please do so!
