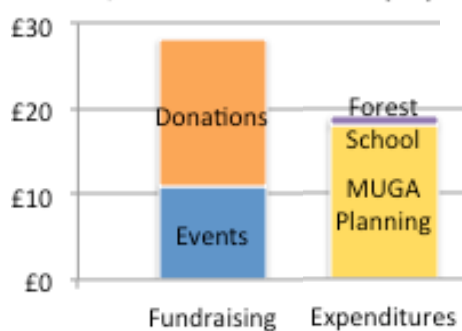
7th Oct: Annual General Meeting

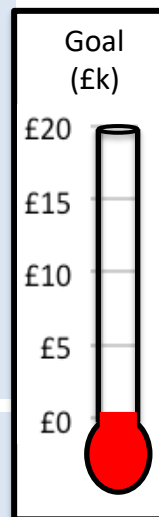
