Drop off/Collection

We have noticed some real benefits to our new drop off and collection arrangements. For example, punctuality has improved and less learning time wasted when children come into school in the he mornings. The added benefit of getting children straight into the school building, during peak traffic times reduces our children exposure to pollution along with the school streets initiative. We are keen to continue to reap the benefits of this, and will make timely adaptations along the way. Therefore, when the children return to school on Wednesday 1st September, they will continue to be dropped off at their year group gate. We will return to a single drop off time, which will be 8.50am. The gates will be open from 8.45am.

There will also be a single point of collection at 3.15pm for all children, apart from our part time Nursery children.

Enrichment clubs will return week beginning Monday 20th September. As usual, the timetable of clubs will be issued during the first two weeks of the term.



For Art we did printing and really enjoyed our topic day.








Year 5 have had a busy creating Haiku poems and creating their Micro-Society.














Year 6 have had a bananza week visiting Chessington, Kidzania, and a day out at Brighton beach. "Wow! What a Year!"
