Nursery Parent Update

We have been reading the story,' Handa's Surprise'. We worked together during our carpet session to recall the animals that took Handa's fruits and tried to understand the reason why there was a surprise at the end of the story. We revisited the different names of the different parts of the book such as front cover, back cover and had fun exploring how to hold books as we turn pages one at a time. We learnt about new fruits such as guava and passion fruit which some of us were not familiar with. We spoke about friendships and some of the things that we need to do to be a good friend such as being kind and sharing.

In numeracy we started learning that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total, so we practised counting and stopping when we get to the last number. We will be revisiting this at every opportunity around our nursery to reinforce the concept.

In physical development, we took a walk around our school, had a go at climbing up the steps and stairs independently without support. We have also been practising using the scissors to cut out printed fruits.

In Understanding the World we compared the setting in our story, 'Handa's Surprise' to London, as well as the traditional clothing worn in our story compared to our clothes.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we had a go at drawing some of the fruits in our story such as banana and orange.

We had a drama workshop, which we really enjoyed and engaged in thoroughly. We have had a wonderful week and have learnt most of our routines as well as what is expected of us. These have helped us to settle well and enjoy being at nursey.

Reception Parent Update

Literacy – Our book of the week is 'Fruits - A Caribbean counting poem' by Valerie Bloom. This story had us thinking about a range of countries around the world. This story introduced us to rhyme for the first time. The children explored what a rhyme was and had a go at finding matching rhyming pairs. We played lots of games to develop their understanding and read other popular rhyming books like 'Room on the broom' and 'Tabby McTat'.

Maths – In maths we have continued to develop our knowledge and understanding of number. Following on from last week, we practiced counting to and back from 10, ordered numbers, went on a number hunt to recognise numerals around our environment and matched the amount to the number.

EAD - For EAD, the children had a go at painting with watercolour. We looked at some fruit that does not grow here in the UK and painted a still life of a fruit bowl. We had to look carefully at the shapes, colours and fruit placement to make an accurate still life painting. Once we had finished we selfevaluated our work by giving ourselves 2 stars and a wish.

UTW – For UTW, we looked at similarities and differences between lives in different countries. We watched a video that followed the daily life of a little girl living in Costa Rica, a country near the Caribbean. We then compared her life to ours and thought about how our way of life was similar or different.

Key Stage One

Year 1 Parent Update

Year 1 have had a wonderful few weeks!

In English, we have been focusing on what makes a super sentence. We have carried on with our story 'Lost in the toy museum' and we have used colourful semantics to write descriptive sentences about the story. We have also written a character description for the main character in the story using a variety of adjectives.

In Maths, we have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes. We have practiced naming and describing the properties of common 2D and 3D shapes. We have had lots of fun being architects and creating our very own shape houses! We also learnt about Venn diagrams and how we can sort the different shapes using them.

In RE, we have explored the four different religions that we are learning about throughout this year; Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and Sikhism. We looked at different symbols and religious items associated with these religions.

In Geography, we continued to look at the United Kingdom. In particular, we focused on England and it's capital city, London. We learnt about the difference between human and physical features and identified different features of London.

In Computing, we have had lots of fun using beebots this week. We have learnt what debugging means and how to debug a beebot.

In Science we practiced labelling the different parts of our bodies and talked about the function of each body part. We also learnt what the 5 senses are and the importance of our senses.



Year 2 Parent Update

This week we took part in a drama workshop called 'Perform'. In this session, we were taken to outer space to complete a special mission to protect planet earth.

In English this week, Year 2 have been finding out about the explorer David Livingstone. We used a range of sources of evidence to research his life. We sequenced his journey across Africa using time conjunctions and expanded noun phrases to make our writing more exciting.

In Maths, we have naming 2D shapes and describing their properties. We used this knowledge to describe 2D shapes. We also completed repeated patterns and explored lines of symmetry by painting one side of a butterfly and folding.

In Science this week, we planned a balanced meal following the guidelines of the food pyramid. After, we explained our food choices for our balanced meal.

In Topic this week, Year 2 have learnt about the United Kingdom and named its four countries and capitals. We learnt facts about each country and chose our favourite ones to write in our book.

In Religious Education this week, for our Judaism topic, we experienced a Shabbat meal. We enjoyed challah bread, grape juice and telling stories.

In PSHE this week, we discussed our personality and talents in a circle time.

In computing this week, we have continued our programming module using 'Scratch'.

In Music this week, we continued our learning about beat and rhythm. We learnt the value of a crotchet and a quaver and clapped rhythms using this musical notation. We have also enjoyed learning our harvest songs.





Lower Key Stage 2

Year 3 Parent Update

In English, year 3 have been exploring play scripts. Children have written a second scene from Cinderella of the Nile and practiced changing scenes in their play script writing.

In Maths, children have been practicing times tables, solving missing number problems and using arrays to represent fact families. Children have also begun learning division, including repeated subtraction.

In Topic, children researched the human and physical features of Egypt, and explored Ancient Egyptian gods and goddesses.


In DT children practiced making pop-up mechanisms, finalising their skills in a pop-up book.

This week on Science Day, children will be making soil shakes to identify the materials found in soil, investigating rock hardness and erosion of rocks.

In PSHE children discussed their achievements and goals in Year 3 and will be celebrating the progress they have made.

Year 4 Parent Update

Another fantastic few weeks in year 4! The children are all fully settled into year 4 life and are thriving during lessons.

In English, the children have spent the week building up to writing a newspaper report on the Caledonian Invasion, lead by Septimius Severus. They have looked at all the key features of a newspaper report, and practiced writing news reports and acting them out as news readers. Children really enjoyed sharing their work with parents, when they visited. They have worked incredibly hard publishing their work.

In Maths, the children have been focusing on formal written methods for multiplication. They consolidated the learning they did in year 3, where they multiplied using the partitioning method and grid method, and then moved onto to expanded method and even the short formal method! They multiplied teen numbers by 1 digit, 2 digit numbers by 1 digit, 3 digit numbers by 1 digit, and some even gave 4 digit numbers a go! Then, we put our knowledge to good use playing a multiplication game! Wow! What a week!

In Science, we set up an experiment over time which helps us understand the importance of keeping our teeth clean. We learnt about the types of teeth we have and how important they all are, and even put our knowledge to the test. We ate small bits of apple using all of our teeth, then tried it with only our front teeth, and all had a good laugh at how hard it was!

In Topic, we learnt all about Roman roads! Did you know, we still have some roads today which were built by the Romans? we learnt where they are and why they built them straight.

In PE, we practised our passing skills again and even began learning how to score!

In RE, we have been focusing on Sikhism, and learnt all about the 10 human gurus and what they have done for Sikhism and how they are remembered and worshiped.

In PSHE, the children have written poems all about themselves!

Thank you so much to all the parents who were able to visit us on Thursday, it was so wonderful to have parents in the lesson and the children loved being able to show their work off.

Year 5 Parent Update

The children of year 5 have had a very exciting half term. It has been so nice getting 'Back to Normal' with them, and look forward to the rest of the year!

In English this week the children have been exploring imagery poetry and it's features. They have been using the five senses, metaphors and similes to bring their poems to life!

In Maths, the children have been developing their multiplication and division skills. This has involved using reasoning to answer problems, and understanding that maths is not only in the classroom but in real life. We strongly urge parents and carers to develop this skill at home, using maths in ever-day situations such cleaning, cooking, playing.

In Science the children have been doing some amazing work, researching the parts of plants and developing their understanding of the reproductive systems of flowers. They have taken part in science walks around Bonneville and were able to distinguish the features very accurately!

In computing the children have been making their own Anglo-Saxon inspired music using the app garage band.

In Topic the children have been developing even more their knowledge as time travellers, specifically this week the succession crisis of 1066, and who was trying to be king!

Can we please ask that the children make sure to get their homework done on time, we have a homework club on Wednesday lunchtimes and we really don't want anyone in it next term.

Well done year 5 for a fantastic term and have a wonderful break!

Upper Key Stage Two

Year 6 Parent Update

Year 6 have been working hard as usual. Another quick reminder that homework for English is set in Google classroom. For Maths, children will need to go onto TT Rockstars and MyMaths. Children have their own individual logins but if there are any problems with accessing their homework they need to let their class teacher know before Wednesday of the following week (when their homework is due). Reading is also expected to be done regularly and a record of this should be made in their reading record at least three times a week minimum.

<u>Maths:</u> In Maths, we started the week by continuing with learning about division. Year 6 have been using short division, long division and dividing using factor pairs. We then moved our learning on, focusing on Fractions. We have been using our multiplication table facts to help us find equivalent fractions.

English: We have been focussing on the features of a narrative, in particular how authors use dialogue in their work to move the story on. We looked at how speech is punctuated and applied this to our ' Big Write' session on Friday. We also focussed on making our work more interesting for our audience by thinking about using interesting vocabulary, synonyms for the word 'said' and cohesive devices.

Humanities: As you know, our topic is Wakanda Forever and in our lesson this week we focused on the history of the ancient city of Benin. We created a timeline that documented the key events that took place as well as discussing the positive and negative impact each event had on the country.

R.E: In R.E we continued to look at Buddhism specifically where Buddhists worship- a temple. We looked at the general features of a temple and then compared the similarities and differences they might display.

PSHE: We continued to look at the topic of 'My Identity' and explored short term and long term goals and how they could be achieved.

Science: Our Science this term is Biology: Evolution and Inheritance. This week we looked at traits and which traits could be inherited from a parent.

P.E: Our P.E days are Monday and Friday. Our focus this term is Tag Rugby and Dance. Please ensure that you have P.E kits on these days.

Computing: We are using the app Garage Band on the iPads and creating a soundtrack to our own narrative based on Black Panther
