Early Years Foundation Stage

Nursery Parent Update

This term we have been learning about minibeast. In PSED, we started talking about being assertive and using our voice to speak up, saying what we want or how we feel confidently. We also talked about our feelings, naming them and learning how to work through to calm ourselves down in order not to get too overwhelmed by them.

In Maths, we began sequencing our observation of the changes we observed and adding the changes from incubator to brooder, using words such as 'first', 'then', 'after'. We went over our numbers and shapes to consolidate our learning.

In phonics and literacy, we have been learning our sound of the week which is 'g' and writing the letters we have learned so far. We are trying to blend the sounds we have learned so far to read words such as 'sat', 'pin' and 'pig'.

In understanding the world, we have been looking at the different habitats of the minibeast and exploring our immediate environment by going on a minibeast hunt. We found so many minibeast under logs such as slugs, worms, centipedes and under leaves such as ladybirds. We have really enjoyed observing our tadpoles change and grow into frogs which we released into our forest school pond.

In EAD, we also used salt dough to make our chosen minibeast adding different materials to add more details such as leaves used as wings. We drew our families again adding more complex details. We shared our family stories with our adults and wrote the first letter sounds of our families such as 'm' for mummy.

We are looking forward to the next term as we get ourselves ready for the next stage of our school life. Have a wonderful rest.

Year 1 Parent Update

Please find below Year 1 buzz bits, Amanda is sending you the pictures separately.

In English we have been exploring rhyming poetry. We used the story 'The snail and the whale' to help us create our own rhyming poems.

In Maths we have been looking at finding the difference by counting back on a number line.

In Geography we have continued our learning about 'At the seaside'. We looked at maps and how maps use symbols to represent features. We practiced using coordinates to find different locations.

In Science we have been exploring the diet of different sea creatures as well as exploring their different physical features and making comparisons.

In PSHE we have been learning about friendly behaviours and how we can use this to help our friends.

In Art we created sea creatures using clay inspired by the sculptor Henry Moore. We used different techniques to help us attach the different parts of our sculptures.






Key Stage One

Year 2 Parent Update This week we were very fortunate to have lots of furry friends visiting year 2! A local lady called Veronica was keen to share her rat and their pups. We had the opportunity to hold the rats and realised the pups were eager to run around and explore the classroom. Don't worry we didn't lose any!

In English this week, children have been exploring and creating book reviews. On Monday we explored a range of book reviews and identified their different features. Towards the end of the week, children put their knowledge of book reviews into writing amazing ones of their own.

In maths, we reminded ourselves of our arithmetic knowledge and the correct methods to use for each operation.

In topic, we learnt all about significant people connected to our local area. Children researched Charlie Chaplin, Ken Livingstone and David Bowie, then created informative fact files using sub-headings. We were able to reflect on their local and global impact.

In PE this week, the two Year 2 classes came together for a selection of athletic activities, which ended with a big relay race.

In RE, we learnt about the Gurdwara which is a Sikh place of worship. We discussed the rooms in a Gurdwara and the purpose of each. Year 2 then made a booklet describing parts of the Gurdwara and it's impact on the community.

In Art this week, children are exploring contrast. They are using different shading techniques with charcoal and pencil and seeing how the techniques can be used to create light and darkness in pictures.

In Science, we are planning an investigation on our topic of plants. We want to see how different variables affect the growth and health of plants. Children will get the chance to decide on the variables they want to explore and what constants need to remain the same for a fair test.

In PSHE we have been looking at diverse families and how families love, care and support each other.


In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of time using analogue, digital and 24 hour clocks. Please take opportunities to practise telling

Year 4 Parent Update

What a wonderful half term in year 4 we've had. Made even better by a fantastic final week of half term! The children have been busy bees this week taking part in science day, art day, international evening and a final day wearing their pyjamas!

In English this half term, we've squeezed in lots of learning. We've written poems in the style of Valerie Bloom and performed them for our groups. We've had a go at creative style writing and come up with our very own story based on the ideas from *The Promise* by Nicola Davies. We've just started researching and sorting lots of facts about The Industrial Revolution, ready to write a chronological report all about it when we come back after half term.

In maths this half term, we've focused on lots of really important life skills. We've been learning about the place value of decimals and focusing specifically on the tenths and hundredths, which lead us perfectly into learning about money! The children learnt how to add, subtract, multiply and divide money, all key life skills for when they're older. We also were practising telling the time to the nearest minute on an analogue and digital clock! The children all worked really hard at this, but this skill can be tricky, so please keep practising telling the time with them at home.

Our new topic this term is 'Saving Our World', we've been learning lots about the Industrial Revolution, and the positive and negative impacts it had on the economic climate and the actual climate of the world! We've learnt about food miles, and how this can be damaging to the world and how it is adding to climate change. They've learnt about Fairtrade and how this affects people, as well as the working conditions during the industrial revolution.

In science this half term, we learnt all about living things and their habitats! We spent the afternoon in forest school, which was such a treat as some of the children haven't been there since year 1 and some haven't been at all! We look some information sheets down, and tried to identify some different living things. Then, we spent a wonderful morning at Clapham Common (thanks again to all our parent helpers, you were all amazing!), where we found local living things and observed them in their habitats. We had an exciting time, we managed to see a carp which a fisherman had caught, lots of parakeets, a heron and even a terrapin!

In art, we've been printmakers! We've spent the half term creating mood boards, sharing ideas and then planning out our print design. We then all got together for art day in the hall! The children made environmentally friendly print boards from recycling cardboard, and created their design. They all turned out amazing and the children were all really pleased.

Next half term, we will be taking 2 trips! The first trip will be to London Zoo on Friday 1st July. Thank you so much to the parents who have already signed up, we have now filled our free of charge parent helper slots. We will also be heading to the South Bank centre to meet the author and illustrator of *Mayhem* at the Museum!! The children will take part in lots of activities and then they will get their very own copy of *Mayhem* at the Museum!

Upper Key Stage 2

Year 5 Parent Update

We want to start by saying thank you for being so supportive in terms of the children's learning. We cannot believe we only have 7 weeks left of the school year! Next half term, we will be visiting Kidzania as part of our topic – Micro society. We are now in the process of writing your child's report, which as you know, will be used for their prospective secondary schools. Wishing you all a happy half term.

Maths: In Maths, we have been learning about geometry – the study of shapes. The children have made exceptional progress in this area – measuring angles using a protractor, calculating angles on a straight line and around a point. We have also consolidated our learning of polygons and quadrilaterals. Next half term we will continue our learning of geometry. MyMaths and Times Tables Rock Stars as part of their homework.

Humanities: Our topic this term is '**Micro Society**'. The children have named their society, voted for their currency and flag. We have been exploring the concept of supply and demand and with this in mind have produced advertising materials for products. They have been so enthused by the topic that it is showing in their level of maturity during lessons.

English: Our English text this half term is 'When the bees fly home' which is a fable focussing on themes of family life and different emotions. The children explored characters and were able to write their own fable. We also examined features of instructions and as a result wrote our own – How to make bees wax candles based on our text.

R.E: In R.E this term, we will be exploring Jesus – divine and human. We explored Christian beliefs about Jesus the son of man and Jesus the son of God.


Computing: This half term the children have been using purple mash to create their own 3D packaging linked to micro society.

P.E. Our P.E days are Wednesday and Friday. Please ensure that you have your P.E kits at school at all times. We will be learning to play basketball.



Science: Our Science this term is properties and changes of materials. We have researched a key scientist called Stephanie Kwolek who was an American scientist that invented an amazingly strong but thin material called Kevlar. We compared materials and investigated what they could be used for taking into account their properties. We have also investigated conductors and insulators. The children carried out a test to find the best material to use for the inner lining of a lunch box.

PHSE: We will be focussing on family. The children now have a better understanding of different types of families and the role each member plays in that family.

Year 6 Parent Update

WOW! What a half term Year 6 have had. The term started of preparing for the end of KS2 SATs; in the second week of May the children all worked really hard and showed true resilience as they took their tests. We are all so proud of them. Thank you to everyone who has supported them at home and a huge well done to the children who have put in so much hard work, especially those who attended before and after school boosters.

This week on Tuesday, we travelled to Stockwell Primary School, where we joined them and Jessop Primary School and had our inaugural BJS Federation Transition Social. The children were all grouped according to the secondary schools that they were going to in September. They all had an opportunity to get to know one another during icebreaker activities then collaborated together to create a presentation about how to have a sensational secondary school experience, their motivations and their ambitions. The day ended with wide games and the children all buzzing with excitement from the new friends they had made.

Maths: In Maths we have been working within our groups to complete a "Theme Park Maths" investigation. The children have been tasked with several activities where they were given a budget and they had to design and draw a map of a theme park based on certain criteria and costs. Activities went on to explore running costs, income, profit and loss. We were able to draw on previous learning in Maths and in our Y5 Topic 'Microsociety'. The children have demonstrated that some will make brilliant business people when they are older! We will continue to use our Maths skills to approach problem solving and investigations.

English: In English, we have had a real focus on writing. Year 6's final judgements for writing aren't made until the end of June so we want to ensure that all the children have the best opportunity as possible to show off what they are capable of. We have been covering a range of genres linked to our Survivor topic including poetry and narratives based on the key text "The Lost Words" and recounts based on the recent tornados in Germany. After half term, we will base our writing on the survival stories from the sinking of RMS Titanic and write diary entries and informal letter.



Humanities: We are really enjoying our "Survivor" topic. In this topic we have been exploring extreme weathers, natural disasters and real life survival stories. We have begun to explore what causes extreme weather and natural disasters, in particular plate tectonics, volcanoes and their impact on communities, and will look earthquakes after the half term. We have used a range of primary and secondary sources to carry out independent research on the sinking of the Titanic. After half term, we will use this research and explore some the survival stories behind this historical event and write a recount.

After the half term we are really looking forward to the trips and events that we have planned for the Year 6 children. Remember that on the first week back we are going to Kidzania on Tuesday 7th June. We are also really excited about our residential trip to Blackland Farm and day trip to Chessington World of Adventures. We will also be putting on a production, so look out for further information regarding that!
