



Polio vaccination for children aged 1 to 9

Polio is a serious infection which can cause permanent paralysis. The virus has been found in London sewage, so children aged 1 to 9 years old are being encouraged to have a polio vaccination for their protection.

To make sure that you have good access to the vaccine, below is a list of vaccination clinics within Lambeth.
