We are excited to announce the launch of the Fathers Reading Every Day (FRED) programme at Bonneville Primary School. FRED, run by the Fatherhood Institute, is a simple but highly successful reading challenge that encourages dads and male role models to read regularly with their children. The programme has been especially effective in helping children, particularly boys, develop a love of reading and build confidence in learning.

As a school, we are committed to strengthening the partnership between home and school, and we recognise the enormous positive impact that fathers and male role models can have on children's learning, confidence and wellbeing. We are therefore delighted to be launching FRED at our school.

**FRED sessions will be run in the EYFS playground every Monday and Friday afternoon from 3.15pm.**

These sessions will last approximately 15 - 20 minutes. There will be a range of different activities for you to take part in with your child and EYFS staff will be on hand to support. There is no expectation for you to attend all sessions but we encourage all Dads and male role models to attend as many as possible. At your first session, you will be asked to sign up and complete a survey for which you will receive a voucher.
